- All sophomores took the PLAN test on November 1. This is the pre-ACT test and will help them prepare for future ACT testing as well as give them a career profile that will be used in their English class with Mr. Bratt.
- Seniors need to get their college applications in by December 1. Several of our students have already been accepted to the colleges of their choice. Many colleges and universities have their scholarship deadlines at that time also. Seniors are also reminded that they must contact the guidance office when sending in college applications so we can send in a high school transcript.
- On-line FAFSA financial aid application information and worksheets for the 2008-2009 school year are available in the guidance office for seniors. The FAFSA must be ready to be sent out as soon as possible after January 1, 2008.
- The county-wide financial aid meeting for college bound senior and junior parents will be held this year at Van Buren High School on December 19 at 7:00 P.M. in the auditorium. There will also be sessions at Findlay High School on January 8 at 7:00 P.M. and at Liberty Benton High School on January 16 at 7:00 P.M. It is recommended that at least one parent attend, especially if this is your first time having a student go on to college.
- The school home page on the internet has all the updated guidance information, scholarships, as well as current news available for viewing. Most local scholarships will be available in the guidance office in January.

The ingredients needed to entertain the festival guests include: 1 King and 1 Queen visiting folks in the Banquet Hall, 1 Middle School Marching Band, 4 choirs singing songs on stage in the Concert Hall, 1 Grand Parade complete with a horse and carriage for the King and Queen, 1 decked-out Princess carriage for some very lovely ladies, droves of spectators lining the street, 1 gym full of 16 competitive games, 1 professional photographer named Craig Bell snapping 1,000's of photos of the partygoers, 2 storytelling areas complete with many special props and talent, and 22 fun craft booths. The ingredients needed to feed the festival goers include: 1 feast complete with 390 meals of chicken, corn on the cob, applesauce, and brownie, 250 bags of popcorn, 15 pounds of pretzels, 455 gingerbread cookies, 8 pounds of icing, assorted M&M's, raisins, gummy bears, and mini-marshmallows, and 22 gallons of apple juice. The ingredients needed to pack away and clean up the festival included: 15 school staff members, 10 students, 16 parent volunteers, and several members of the Van Buren School maintenance staff.

One final ingredient that made the festival a success was the beautiful fall day.

The finished product would not have been as good without everyone's help and cooperation. Thanks to everyone who made this year's Knight's Fest a tremendous success.
