HIGH SCHOOL 14th ANNUAL OPENING KNIGHT

Van Buren High School will be hosting our 14th Annual Opening Knight, which will be held on Tuesday, August 13, 2013, beginning at 6:30 P.M. Parents and students are asked to enter the school through the front doors closest to the high school offices. The schedule provided below has been developed in an attempt to increase the efficiency of the evening and also to allow students and their parents the opportunity to meet with teachers before the start of classes. During Opening Knight, students will have fall pictures taken (students must wear a school appropriate shirt/blouse), pay school fees for the year, receive required forms, pick up their schedules and pick up their school sponsored Netbooks. Parents are invited to attend a meeting to meet with the principal and to review important school procedures and policy changes for this year. Schedules will only be available the evening of Opening Knight and only after student pictures and school fees have been paid. If, for some reason, you are unable to attend on August 13th, you will need to pick up your schedule on the first day of classes, Monday, August 19, 2013. Parents are welcome to tour the building or socialize with the staff and friends throughout the evening. After student pictures, payment of fees, and schedule pick up, students are welcome to do the same.

- 6:30 Seniors and Juniors and parents begin to get their pictures taken, pay school fees, pick up schedules, and receive their school sponsored Netbooks. Seniors (ID Cards only) and Juniors will have pictures taken in the community room and then move on to pay school fees, get their schedules and Netbooks. (Mr. Brand and Mr. Zender will be in the Auditorium Lobby to answer any questions about the upcoming school year.)
- 7:30 Sophomores and Freshmen and their parents begin to get their pictures taken, pay school fees, pick up schedules and receive their school sponsored Netbooks. Both groups will have their pictures taken in the Community Room and then move on to pay school fees, get their schedules and Netbooks.
- 8:30 New school year information will be presented to Sophomore and Freshmen parents in the auditorium. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Class fees are due by September 25, 2013 - interim report time. If you cannot comply with this time line, please make other arrangements with the Middle School/High School Office.	Class fees are due by September 25, 2013 - interim report time. If you cannot comply with this time line, please make other arrangements with the Elementary Office.
	The Board of Education has adopted a policy for Free and Reduced-Price workbook and class fees. Applications will be in the middle/high school office, elementary office, and superintendent's office. Verification of income is needed for approval.	
Appropriate Dress:	This is addressed in the Student Handbook. Some of the inappropriate dress includes: (1) Garments with words, designs, or patches that are obscene, disrespectful or suggestive which refer to sex, alcohol, tobacco, or drugs (including advertisements of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs); (2) Clothing that exposes the midriff, cleavage, and/or backless attire; Shirts/tops should be worn so that no cleavage is visible; (3) Tank tops or other shirts not complying with school dress code may be worn under shirts that do comply with the dress code. Shirts containing less than a three inch band from collar to the shoulders will be considered unacceptable; (4) All shorts, skirts, dresses, etc. shall be at least mid-thigh length or longer. Shorts, skirts, dresses, etc. that are "slit" above mid-thigh are also unacceptable. Mid-thigh length is defined as the midpoint of the area from the top of the inseam to the top of the knee. Clothing that is tight fitting such as spandex, tights, or yoga pants. Sleepwear/pajamas or slippers.	
Absence Notification Policy	If your child is ill (or for any other reason) and will not be attending school, CALL THE SCHOOL between the hours of 7:30 A.M. and 8:30 A.M. Lack of information from you, the parent, may necessitate a MISSING CHILD REPORT. Call the High/Middle School at 299-3384 and the Elementary at 299-3416.	
Dr. / Dentist Appointments:	If your child has an appointment, advance notice from you, the parent, as to date, time, and place will assure ready pick-up at the school. Please indicate pick up time. Middle school and high school students <u>must</u> sign in and out in the High School Office. Elementary office must be notified when an elementary student is picked up.	
Weather Announcements:	Tune to WFIN, WKXA, WIMJ, WBVI, or WQTL for weather announcements. Should weather favor us with unseasonable climatic conditions, announcements will be made to accommodate those variances.	
Bussing:	Temporary changes in bussing may be arranged by sending a note from a parent to the Principal's Office for approval. Permission will be granted for family emergencies, for babysitting purposes, or if parents are out of town and the student is staying with another family. This note needs to be approved as early in the day as possible so the appropriate driver can be notified of this change. If you have questions, please call the Elementary at 299-3416 or the High/Middle School offices at 299-3384.	
Parking:	Due to the limited parking available; students driving to school must complete a Parking Permit Application and turn it into the High School Office.

PARENTS: IMPORTANT SCHOOL BUS SAFETY ALERT HELP US PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN AS THEY TRAVEL TO AND FROM SCHOOL

Certain types of children's clothing can create a hazard as your child gets off the school bus. Especially dangerous are:

- Long, dangling jacket or sweatshirt drawstrings
- Long backpack straps
- Long scarves or other loose clothing

Such clothing can be caught in the bus handrail, door, or other equipment as the child gets off the bus.

In recent years, a number of children across the U.S. have had their clothing caught as they exited the bus.

Several of these children were dragged by the bus and then killed when the bus ran over them.

Please take the time to check your children's clothing to make sure it is safe.

Also, please talk with your child about the following safety rules.

- Stay away from the Danger Zones around the bus.
- Don't try to pick up something dropped near the bus - the bus driver might not see you.
- Remember that other motorists don't always stop for a stopped school bus - use extreme caution whenever getting on or off the bus.

Release of Student Names to the Military

We are now REQUIRED by law to release the names and addresses of all students in grades 10-12 to any military branch that requests them. We must do this unless you contact the high school office **in writing** by Friday, September 13, 2013, that you do NOT want your child's name given out. Without your letter stating that you do not want your child's name released, we MUST give all names and addresses out.

SCHOOL BUS PROCEDURES

Parents, please review the following procedures with your children. It is important that they know in detail what is expected of them when they ride a school bus.

School bus transportation should be regarded as a privilege, which will be kept by students only as long as they behave responsibly. All bus students must abide by the following rules at all times if they wish to maintain the privilege of riding on the bus:

- **The bus driver is the adult authority on the bus. He/she is in charge.**
- **Silence must be maintained while a bus is crossing railroad tracks.**
- **Be courteous to others. Cursing, teasing, etc. cannot be tolerated.**
- **No eating or drinking on the bus.**
- **Please help keep the bus clean. Don't throw paper or other objects.**
- **You must stay in your seat at all times.**
- **Do not extend anything outside a school bus window.**
- **No smoking. Do not bring matches on a school bus.**
- **Please do not mark on or damage seats.**
- **No fighting.**
- **This is not an all-inclusive list of inappropriate behaviors. If students use good common sense, they will not have worry about being disciplined.**

School bus drivers must use appropriate disciplinary measures to maintain order and safety on the buses. However, when student misbehavior is so inappropriate, as determined by the driver, that it is a threat to order and safety, a formal set of discipline procedures will be followed.

FIRST OFFENSE

A written report will be submitted to the appropriate school principal. A copy will be placed in the student's file. A copy may also be mailed to the parent. The principal may also hold a conference with the student and parent.

SECOND OFFENSE

The student's seat may be reassigned by the driver. A telephone contact with the parent will be made by the driver and/or principal. Documentation of the incident will be placed in the student's file. Bus riding privileges could be stopped for a period of time, and other disciplinary measures including detention, suspension, and/or expulsion could be used.

THIRD OFFENSE, ETC.

Bus riding privileges will be stopped for a period of time determined by the principal. Other serious disciplinary actions could also be taken.

CLASS OF 2014 STUDENTS AND PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

Your senior year is right around the corner, and that means you will be getting your senior pictures taken. I would encourage you to try to have your pictures taken this summer so you will not have any problems making the Friday before Thanksgiving deadline to turn in the picture you want to appear in the yearbook. If you are not able to have your pictures taken during the summer, I suggest at least making the appointment during the summer so that the pictures can be taken in plenty of time to meet the deadline. The yearbook staff would also like to include a baby picture (any age) of each senior in the yearbook, and that can be turned in along with the senior picture. Those pictures will be returned to the student at the end of the school year. News From the Superintendent

By the time you read this article, a new school year will be upon us. I hope that everyone has had an enjoyable summer.

Preparations for a new school year have been completed. Fall athletes and musicians are already filling our hallways. As usual, the custodial and maintenance staffs have worked hard to repair, clean, and ready the buildings and grounds for a new school year. The busses have been inspected and are ready to hit the road. Following the Board meeting on Thursday, August 8, all staffing should be in place for the upcoming year. While we only had one retirement last year, resignations in the Athletic Department and the Treasurer's Office along with an additional staff person to help with the technology department has brought some new members to our staff. Additionally, we have a couple of individuals returning from leaves of absence taken last year. Everything seems to be in place for another outstanding year at Van Buren.

Like last year, we still have a lot of work to do with the Common Core, PARCC testing, OTEs, SLO's, etc. Preliminary data has us as a borderline A/B school on the new state report card. I know that you, along with me, are not satisfied with this ranking. We want Van Buren to be recognized as the premier, outstanding school that we know it is both at the local and state levels.

Please review your student's bus and class schedules. Check the school district calendar. We will have 4 waiver days for staff professional development this year to work on many of the items listed in the above paragraph along with continued training in school safety and emergencies. We will also be utilizing up to three on-line make up days for any calamity days above the state approved limit of 5 excused days this year. Our 1 to 1 technology program and our teacher's use of Moodle should make this an easy task for our students if needed. The building principals and teachers will be providing additional information on this process. Please make an effort to attend your child's open house meeting with the building principal. Become a regular at school events and functions. Join the various booster groups.

Many of you may be aware of several changes that the state legislature approved in the new budget bill this summer. One of the big changes involves the removal of the homestead and roll back exemptions on property taxes on new and replacement levies. This change does not affect continuing and renewal levies. THE CHANGES IN STATE LAW WILL NOT AFFECT THE REPLACEMENT LEVY ON THE NOVEMBER BALLOT! A more detailed explanation of this and other changes will be addressed in future newsletters.

Welcome back and here's to another highly successful year.

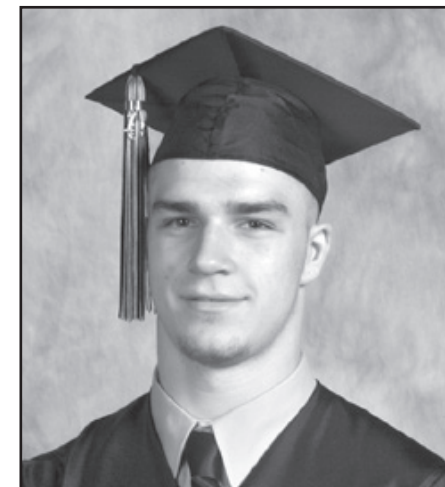

All Sports Passes & Season Tickets for 2013-2014

All BVC JV/Varsity tickets prices are \$6 for adults and \$4 for students. Middle School prices remain the same at \$3 Adult and \$2 Student. Van Buren School will once again be offering an All Sports Pass which will entitle the pass holder into every regular home sporting event, (this now includes the Van Buren Wrestling Invitational and all track invitationals). These passes are non-transferable. The family members, upon purchasing the passes, will have their names put on the pass.

Passes must be present to enter the event. It does not matter how many members are in the family.

1. **FAMILY PASS - \$250.** This plan includes general admission for the parents and all immediate family members in grades 1-12. It includes all home athletic events, junior high through varsity.
2. **STUDENT ALL SPORTS PASS - \$75.** General admission for any student, grades 1-12 to all home athletic contests, junior high through varsity.
3. **ADULT ALL SPORTS PASS - \$125.** General admission for one adult to all home athletic contests, junior high through varsity.
4. **SEASON FOOTBALL PASS - \$30/ADULT, \$20/STUDENT.** General admission to all six home varsity football games.
5. **SEASON BOYS BASKETBALL PASS - \$66/ADULT, \$44/STUDENT.** General admission for all home boys' varsity basketball games.
6. **SEASON GIRLS BASKETBALL PASS - \$60/ADULT, \$40/STUDENT.** General admission for all home girls' varsity basketball games.

3. All pass holders, including senior citizens, will receive a pass. **You must have your pass to enter the game.** This will help our ticket takers greatly.
